Preparation

The PSAT/NMSQT evaluates the academic skills your child has developed over time in school. Therefore, taking challenging academic courses and reading widely are the best ways for your child to get ready.

Still, your child can take these steps now, to plan ahead:

Test date for 2011 is Wednesday, October 12

Visit the high school counselor to find out about registering; learn the correct date, time and location of the school's test administration; and pick up a copy of the PSAT/NMSQT *Official Student Guide*.

Read the PSAT/NMSQT *Official Student Guide* and take the full-length practice test inside. Students should review the *Guide* to be sure they understand all the test directions and are familiar with the types of questions asked. They can also <u>get complete answer explanations online</u> for all the questions on the practice test.

Prepare for the PSAT/NMSQT online and access test dates, more practice questions and useful tips.

Test Date

Your child has the opportunity to take the PSAT/NMSQT in October at Cashion High School, the 2011 test is given on Wednesday, October 12 or. To register for the test, your child should speak to the school counselor.

Score Report Plus

Scores are reported to schools in December. At that time, your child receives Score Report Plus, which

includes not only itemized feedback on test questions but also information about skill strengths and weaknesses.

My College QuickStart

Students who take the PSAT/NMSQT receive free access <u>My College QuickStart</u>, a personalized college planning tool that complements the Score Report Plus. Your child can use the code provided on the score report, to access:

My Online Score Report — an enhanced score report that allows students to review each test question, their answers and the correct answers with answer explanations

My SAT Study Plan — a customized SAT study plan based on students' PSAT/NMSQT test performance, highlighting skills for review and practice

My Personality — a detailed personality test that helps students learn about themselves and discover majors and careers that fit their strengths and interests

My Major & Career Matches — extensive information about majors and careers, including insights about what to expect and what courses to take now

My College Matches — a starter list of colleges based on students' home state and indicated choice of major

Students can access My College QuickStart until they graduate from high school.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL JUNIORS AND SENIORS:

Cashion HS juniors are allowed one college campus visit (one day total) each year. Seniors are allowed two college campus visits (two days total) per year. These visits are excused and do not count against absences IF the student follows district procedure: Prior to the day of the college campus visit, the student must return to the Counseling Office a Campus College Day Form, complete with basic information (including the date of the campus visit, the name of the college, and the parent's signature). On the day of the actual visit, the student needs to take with him/her the Official College Visit Form. It must be completed on the campus tour, signed by a campus official, and returned to Mrs. Cowan in the Counseling Office the next day. The two forms are available below:
