This past summer has been very busy and productive in preparing for the 2008-2009 school year. The bond issue that past in February of 2007 has allowed for a great deal of progress in our schools. We have been afforded new buses, heat and air conditioning renovations, football field improvements, a new Ag truck, cafeteria renovations, and a new school building. We are very proud and pleased with the enhancements to our school and school programs.

The Cashion School Board is currently exploring the idea of a new bond election that could be held in February of 2009. While we have made vast improvements and expansions to our campus, we still have numerous needs that must be addressed. Our current funding will not accommodate for facility improvements, so a bond issue is truly the only way to obtain the finances necessary to complete major facility improvements. Some of the items that have been discussed for a new bond issue are as follows: survey and repair roofing systems, renovation of restroom facilities, replacement of worn and outdated flooring, replacement of windows, renovation of library, renovation of the family and consumer science classroom, upgrade computers and technology, band equipment, replace seating in the auditorium, replace seating in the gymnasium, purchase of an activity bus. This is not an all inclusive list, and it is doubtful that we can accommodate every item on this list. However, the fact remains that our school and school programs have needs and the passage of a new bond issue is vital to the continued progress of our school.

We have recently received our district tests scores from last year. I am excited to announce that both our high school and elementary scores have improved significantly. Our staff and students are to be commended for their academic efforts. While I do not believe that test scores are the driving force of education, I do feel that they allow for a great deal of

incite as to the strengths and weaknesses of a school. We will celebrate this success and also look for ways in which we can continue to improve.

We have started the year with quite a few new faces. We have several new staff members we are thankful to have, and we have also added about twenty new students. This growth is good for our school system. An increase in our student enrollment creates additional state funding, and will in time allow us to expand our curriculum offerings.

I again want to thank our parents, patrons, and the community of Cashion. Your continued generous support has been essential in the successes of our school system. Our school will continue to prosper with the benevolence of the community. Families want to be a part of something progressive and successful. We have new and improved facilities, increasing test scores, successful programs, a talented and compassionate staff, and a supportive and generous community.
